

Tips for saving your Student Aid Report from the FAFSA website

1. On the My FAFSA page, under the 2022-23 tab, scroll down the page and click “View Student Aid Report”.

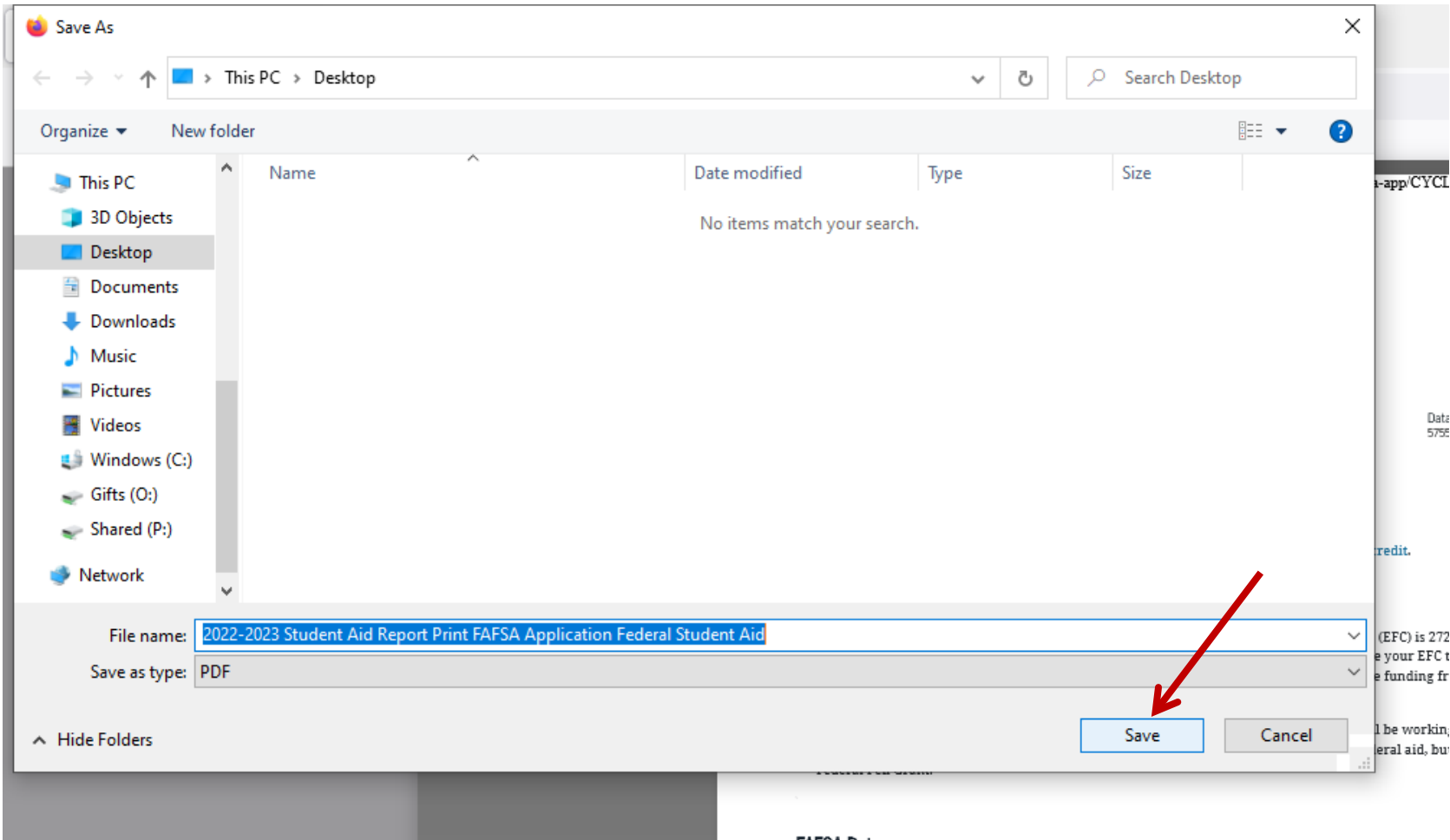
